Did you know that 2020 is the Year of Evangelism?

Many individuals and ministries are sensing that 2020 is a significant year in which we will see the church in the UK grow. In 2020 churches and ministries are working together for an intentional, strategic and Spirit-filled year of mission across the UK called Advance 2020.

The campaign Advance 2020 was launched at a conference in Lambeth Palace in 2018 with over a hundred leaders present. Those involved in the campaign include Hope, the Evangelical Alliance (EA) and the Church of England.

Their inspiration was Isaiah 60:1, 'Arise, shine, for your light has come.'

It is hoped that a united approach will lead to "the gospel being taken to the nation on an unprecedented scale".

There is a definite wind of change coming for our churches. If you talk with Christians in our deanery, this is true for them too.

For instance, in our three churches, we saw this momentum grow throughout last year as we all shared in the experience of LYCiG. We became a little braver and tried new ways of sharing the good news of Jesus with our community. And our prayer is that we will continue to do so into 2020.

As our churches grow and shape themselves to the opportunities we are presented with, it would be easy to think growth can be achieved through our imaginative ideas and in our own strength. However, it is only as we allow God to lead us and inspire us that lives will be transformed.

To this end, as we begin 2020, let us commit ourselves to asking Jesus to breath the breath of evangelism into our lives and the breath of Jesus, the Lion of Judah, into our hearts. I am reminded of C.S. Lewis' great Lion who represents Jesus in 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe'. When she is told Aslan is coming, Susan doubtfully asks, 'Is he quite safe? I shall feel rather nervous about meeting a lion". Mr Beaver confidently answers, "Safe? Who said anything about safe? 'Course he isn't safe. But he's good. He's the King, I tell you."

So, let's make 2020 about Jesus and join in with Christians across the country, proclaiming aloud the Good News of Christ.

Jesus isn't safe, but He is good! The voice that our communities need to hear is the voice of Jesus. We often let Him whisper but we need to set Him free and let him roar about his power to save, about the love of God and how He wants to make a real difference in our lives.


